6.1 Income

Precept It was agreed to recommend an increase of £725 pounds to £18,250. If the 2018/2019 band D equivalents remained the same as 2017/2018 this would result in an increase in the Parish Council charge for Band D dwellings of £1.25 per annum

2017/2018 604.35 band D equivalents Precept £17,500 \div 604.35 = £28.95 2018/2019 604.35 band D equivalents Precept £18,250 \div 604.35 = £30.19

The charge for each other bands is calculated by multiplying the Band D charge by the appropriate scaling factor i.e. Band A - 6/9 B 7/9 C 8/9 E 11/9 F 13/9 G 15/9 H 18/9

6.3 <u>Deficit</u> Mainly because of proposed exceptional expenditure for Seat Repairs and the Olde Forge Stores forecourt the proposed budget's expenditure exceeds income by £2,636. The sub-committee considered that, as the estimated General Reserve at the end of 2017/2018 is well in excess of the recommended level and that Earmarked Reserves are very generous the Council should, as an exception, budget for a deficit in 2018/2019 rather than apply for a significant increase in the precept.
